**An Evening with Pianist Dan Saunders** kicks off the series on Monday, July 22, at 7 PM. We are delighted to welcome back this Perry native to the ACWC's stage for another concert! Dan is currently an assistant conductor for the Metropolitan Opera in New York City. He is also an in-demand pianist who has performed on the world stage with such luminaries as Jessye Norman, Kiri TeKanawa, Kathleen Battle, Tatiana Troyanos and Dimitri Hvorostovsky; more recently in NY's Central Park with Grammy Award-win-

## PUPPET ART & ARTISTRY OF JEGHETTO OPENS JUNE 20 AT ACWC GALLERY

**"If you think you can win. You will win. If you think you will lose. You will lose. The choice is up to you". - Tarish Pipkins aka Jeghetto**

The ACWC, in collaboration with the NYS Puppet Festival, is pleased to showcase the work of **Jeghetto**. This brilliant optimistic artist's work will be displayed in our Perry Main Street gallery. The exhibition will open on Thursday, June 20, with a public reception starting at 6:30 PM.

**Tarish Pipkins, aka Jeghetto**, has been building puppets for over 20 years and is the Artistic Director of Jeghetto's Entertainment LLC. He has produced and directed his shows in puppet theater, collaborates with other theaters on commission, and incorporates giant puppets in his Interactive Puppet Installations for the public to engage with.

However, Jeghetto says "I'm particularly passionate about my stage production titled **THE HIP HOP ERA OF 5P1N0K10 (Spinokio)**. It's an afro-futuristic puppet show about an android who wants to be a real B-boy". The show has experienced an impressive tour with appearances in Atlanta, NYC, Detroit, Chicago, NC, and New Orleans. The story will be published as a graphic novel and adapted into a short film funded by Heather Henson's Handmade Puppet Dreams.

Jeghetto serves on the board of the Jim Henson Foundation and has worked on music videos, commercials, and television with celebrities such as Missy Elliott, Pharrell Williams, and Alec Baldwin.

### **Jeghetto thinks Puppetry is Magic.**

He is a self taught Jack of all trades and a visual artist with expertise in several media. He was always creative, making and building things with whatever resources he could find from a young age. He started building

puppets at the age of 30. Now he is known as a self taught master builder and puppeteer.

Before Jeghetto jumped into puppetry full-time he taught social skills to students on the spectrum through puppetry. He and his wife ran a level 3 group home as therapeutic foster parents for a few years and continued as foster parents in their home. Teaching children and exposing them to the arts remains a passion for Jeghetto. Jeghetto's lived optimism comes from his belief that he is truly blessed. Born and raised in a small town south of Pittsburgh, he witnessed the economic devastation that eventually came with the loss of the steel mills. He was raised by a single mother in a community that would become overrun with drugs and gangs. Throughout this time, his family and neighbors helped each other and shared their resources. Today he has a beautiful family whose members are actively involved in the arts and participate with him in many of his projects. They have a home in rural North Carolina. He believes this is a testament to the fact that "things can change for the better". His advice to those starting out is to do it now. "Don't wait for that perfect time or those tools or fancy equipment that you think you need to get started," he says. "Start with what you have..." He says it is important to surround yourself with a team of winners. "Distance yourself from [negative] people and situations."

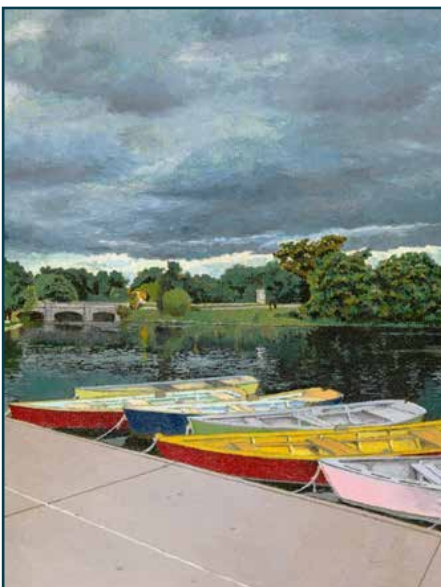

**ACWC JULY EXHIBIT: 2024 FEATURED CHALK ARTIST  
MICHAEL THOMPSON**

The ACWC is pleased to feature the work of Michael Thompson, the 2024 featured chalk artist at Perry's 18th Annual Chalk Art Festival. Thompson's work will be displayed in the ACWC's second-floor gallery this summer in an exhibit from July 5 through 26.

Michael Thompson is a recently retired VW mechanic who fell in love with making art in the first grade. However, his elementary school clay pot and papier-mache projects did not lead to the artistic progress he desired. Then, a chance happening upon a used Jon Nagy drawing lesson book at a rummage sale opened the doors for Mike to understand the fundamentals of drawing. Mike began drawing more, but it wasn't until his wife Wendy signed him up for a chalk-drawing event in Lockport that he started working with colors. That experience led Mike to start painting. Starting small, with basic subjects, he experimented with various mediums and techniques. Oils are his current favorite, but he is comfortable with acrylics, watercolors, and, most recently, gouache. Mike intends to continue with chalk as long as his mechanic-worn body holds up. We look forward to welcoming everyone to see this exhibition, especially during the Chalk Art Festival.

Susan believes the ACWC's gallery space is a good match for the dialog she hopes to generate, and the ACWC is pleased to help facilitate this conversation through the *Narrative Paintings: Rural Voices Rising* exhibition.

"The human figure has always been deeply a part of my work," states Hoffer in her *Statement of Purpose*, "...for to me, the experience of being present while with others is as ordinary and extraordinary as breathing. When I moved to the Adirondack Park in rural upstate NY, my relationship with the painted figure became integral to adjusting to my new surroundings. Historically, rural identity has been portrayed as having certain characteristics, but by capturing real conversations with real people in real time, I began to understand shared experience that both transcended demographics and challenged cultural perceptions." Hoffer began her extensive career studying at Molloy University in Rockville Centre, NY, receiving a BS in Arts and Education. Her studies continued with further graduate coursework in painting, drawing, print-making and ceramics. She received an MFA in Painting from Northern Vermont University (Johnson State Campus) in 2006. She has had solo exhibitions across New York state, including at the Schweinfurth Art Center in Auburn; View Center for Arts and Culture in Old Forge (both in 2023) North Country Arts in Glens Falls; Widlund Gallery, North Creek (both in 2022); *Painted Stories* at Lake George Arts Project in 2021, and more, as well as in Vermont. She has participated in group shows since 1996, both in New York, the U.S., and internationally. Hoffer has received many awards, including the two most recent *Best in Show* awards in the North Country Arts Juried Invitational in Glens Falls in 2022, and *MADE IN NY 2022* at the Schweinfurth Art Center. She has several residencies, grants, commissions, and representations in private collections. She has published articles and features in Artists' Talks which can be viewed on YouTube.
